

	IAEA	Euratom
Nuclear Materials	Art. I 12 nuclear material means any source or special fissionable material as defined in Article XX of the Statute. IAEA Statute Art. XX (3) The term "source material" shall not be interpreted as applying to ore or ore residue.	Art. 197 of Euratom Treaty 'Nuclear materials' defined as "ores, source materials or special fissile materials"



Reporting Requirements

- Reporting exports/imports of uranium for nuclear purposes
- Additional Protocol
 - reporting of # of mines, concentration, production output and potential
 - Unconventional resources for non-nuclear purposes

- Bilateral treaties to frame UOC trade
- Digitalised inventory database
- Well-trained, educated staff
